The Injury Prevention Program at Cheyenne Regional Medical Center serves families through the Emergency Department and Mother Baby Unit car seat program, the car seat inspection station and the special needs restraint program.

### From 2004-2008:

- NINETEEN CLASSES have been held for Cheyenne Regional staff members on the procedures of car seat distribution in the ED and MBU departments.
- Thirty-seven staff members have been trained and 218 SEATS have been distributed to families in need.
- SIX special needs restraints have been distributed to families in need of a seat/vest for children that do not fit in a conventional child restraint.
- From 2002-2008, 4,121 SEATS have been inspected at the car seat inspection station located at Cheyenne Regional and 2,213 SEATS have been distributed.
- DIRECT SAVINGS IN MEDICAL COSTS FOR THE 2,213 CAR SEATS DISTRIBUTED = \$4.6 MILLION.
